Being one of the oldest nations in Europe, the Estonians have already lived in this area for 13,000 years. Almost a half of Estonia's territory is covered by forest and woodland. There is a lot of space to breathe! Estonia attracts visitors to its medieval Hanseatic towns, to the large areas of almost virgin nature, to its large and small islands and sandy beaches and because of the possibility of experiencing the busy city life as well as the peace and quiet of nature. The venue - Pühajärve Recreation and Conference Hotel



You are invited to Estonia at the most beautiful time of the year just after midsummer when nights are the shortest and days the warmest. The venue for GIC 2004 is the beautiful and well-loved village resort of Pühajärve in Southern Estonia. The hotel is located in a 14th century manor complex by the superb Lake Pühajärv ("Holy Lake").

You will be surrounded by the most beautiful nature and a

lot of privacy, far away from the city noise. In addition to the old manor house, a new wing of the hotel has recently just been finished, offering plenty of possibilities to have a good time: a big swimming pool, whirlpools, saunas, a bowling alley, free internet connection, many workshop rooms, both inside and outdoors. In addition, you can enjoy various services of the health centre. Child-care can be arranged if the organizers receive sufficient advance notice from those parents planning to bring their children with them. Most of the rooms available are double rooms with only a limited number of single and triple rooms (a double room with an extra bed). All rooms have private bathroom, telephone and TV.

Travelling

You can reach Estonia by car, boat, ferry, plane or train. A shuttle to the venue will be organized from Tallinn where the boats and planes arrive. It takes about 3 hours by car or by bus.
